

**URSULA, THE ANGRY UTERUS
FALLOPIAN TUBE PATTERN (MAKE 2)**

SUPPLIES

3.0 OR 3.5 mm hook

#4 medium worsted acrylic yarn

Stitch marker, scissors, yarn needle, two 6" pipe cleaners, ruler

ABBREVIATIONS ch: chain; R: round; sc: single crochet; sl st: slip stitch, sc2tog: decrease by 1;

Keep going until the tube is 5 1/4" long.				

Insert & attach tube	Fasten off. With your tube in hand, line up the protruding pipe cleaner with a gap between stitches at the widest point of the uterus, roughly centered from front to back. Insert the cleaner into the gap. It may require some pushing and wiggling to penetrate the stuffing.
	Once the cleaner has disappeared into the uterus, use the yarn tail to sew around the tube until it's secure. Weave in the remaining end, and cut.
	Repeat the process with the other tube on the other side of the uterus. Before sewing the second tube, look at the uterus from all sides to be sure that the tubes are aligned both horizontally and vertically. Once both tubes are secured, bend them to mimic hands on hips.
